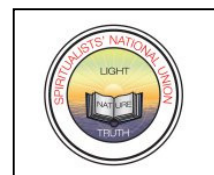


SPIRITUALISTS NATIONAL UNION TRAINING & AWARDS COMMITTEE

TUTOR TRAINING ACCESS WEEKEND



The strategic aim of this programme is to provide teacher training for Spiritualists to promote SNU Spiritualism.

This programme is suitable for candidates who wish to organise, teach and assess within the following avenues at home and abroad: AFC centres and colleges, education schemes, churches, healing groups, SNUi, Lyceum and specialist or guest tutoring and schools.

The objective is to ensure that candidates have both practical and theoretical training in teaching and assessing to accepted standards comparable with further education.

Those successfully completing will be able to organise the learning environment, develop promotional literature, plan sessions, design courses and resource materials, use a variety of teaching methods and aids, assess learning styles, choose and conduct standardised assessment procedure to evaluate learners' progress.

In addition, they will be able to comply with the laws relating to:-

- Record keeping
- The organisation in which they teach
- Equal opportunities
- Inclusivity and development of key skills

For the purpose of this course, currency of information and training is defined as two years.

Requirements for registration:

Candidates must: be SNU award holders, i.e. CSNU/DSNU in Speaking, Demonstrating, Healing or Administration.

Some students who have years of teaching experience but have not actually gained Awards are also invited to apply. Conditional upon subsequently gaining an Award, the CSNUt can then be granted if the training has been completed.

All applications must have:

- have at least 12 months experience of teaching in a Spiritual environment.
- present a portfolio detailing courses, workshops etc done in the past.
- provide their own paper, pens and pencils, rulers and any art materials used.

- arrange their own accommodation for the weekend. There is a Travel Lodge and Premier Inn very close to the Centre.

Cost:

The cost of the first weekend, March 9th, 10th and 11th 2012 will be £100.00 per student.

Supper on Friday evening consisting of a variety of sandwiches and cakes.

Lunch on Saturday and Sunday.

Tea and coffee and biscuits served throughout the weekend.

Tutor fees.

£15.00 to the Training & Awards Committee who will use this money to provide Bursaries for this course.
